

Snowman Christmas Cheese Ball Recipe



- 28 oz block of cream cheese at room temperature
- 3 1/2 cups sharp cheddar cheese at room temperature
- 1 oz package of ranch seasoning mix
- 1 1/2 cups finely shredded jack cheese
- 1 baby carrot
- whole peppercorns

- Let cream cheese and sharp cheddar come to room temperature. In the bowl of a stand mixer fitted with a paddle attachment, combine cream cheese, cheddar cheese and ranch dressing mix.
- Divide cheese mixture and form one smaller cheese ball for the head and one larger cheese ball for the body. Transfer cheese mixtures to two separate sheets of plastic wrap. Refrigerate for at least 4 hours, or overnight. Can be made several days ahead.
- Right before serving, press shredded cheese into cheese ball. Place on a serving plate and place smaller cheese ball onto larger cheese ball.
- Slice the tip off of a baby carrot and press into cheese ball to make a nose. Use whole peppercorns for mouth, eyes and buttons. Serve with crackers press into cheese ball to make a nose.
- **Cheese Ball can be mixed and refrigerated up to three days before. Add jack cheese and snowman decorations right before serving. Serve with crackers.

Classic Sugar Cookies

A blank canvas waiting for a dollop of frosting and a sprinkle of sprinkles, this [sugar cookie recipe](#) produces four dozen delicious morsels.

Ingredients

Directions

- 2 3/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 cup butter, softened
- 1 1/2 cups white sugar
- 1 egg

- Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Mix together flour, baking soda and baking powder in a small bowl.
 - In another bowl, mix the butter and sugar until smooth, then beat in the egg and vanilla. Gradually blend the dry ingredients from step one to this mixture.
 - Once mixed, roll rounded teaspoonfuls of dough into small balls and place on a baking sheet.
- Bake 8-10 minutes at 375 degrees until cookies are golden brown.

Exterior Holiday Decorating Guidelines

- Holiday décor can be hung the Friday after Thanksgiving and must be removed by New Years Day.
- Wreaths allowed under wall lights, but not attached to light fixture.
- No decorations are to be hung from wall lights.
- No decorations or plants allowed on stairways handrails, walkways, shrubs, lawns or carports.
- Garland is allowed on lampposts only.
- No electrical lights allowed anywhere.
- Red and Green light bulbs may replace the outside wall light only during the holiday season.
